

# TOP 5 THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

## 1 THE SERVICE EXPERIENCE

Preschoolers love to discover new things! That's why we provide fun, interactive, learning experiences in an engaging atmosphere where your preschooler can learn about Jesus in bite-sized pieces each week! Your child will be introduced to small-group-style teaching where a teacher will help them engage in the lesson and with other kids. We believe a consistent class is best for preschoolers, so we encourage you to attend the same service each week. It's the best way for them to make friends and build a relationship with their small group leader.

## 2 WHAT TO BRING

You may bring diapers, pull-ups, and extra clothes to class if needed, but due to known and unknown allergies we ask that you please keep diaper bags, backpacks, and all other food and drink items with you. To avoid personal toys getting broken, we ask that you hang onto them during class. If a comfort toy, blanket, or a sippy cup (water only) is needed, let one of our volunteers know, and we will make an exception!

## 3 BATHROOM BREAKS? WE CAN HELP!

A bathroom break happens during the first part of class time. Outside of this designated time, we will make every effort to recognize any signals your child may make to let us know that a bathroom is needed. For the safety of your child, two background-checked adult females will direct all kids to secure restrooms for bathroom breaks and assist three-year-olds with diaper changing if needed.

## 4 WELLNESS

We care about the health of your child and the other kids too! Therefore, we ask that all kids who are experiencing a fever of 99.8 or above, vomiting, or have started taking an antibiotic within the last 24 hours not come to class on that day. Additionally, we thoroughly clean and disinfect all classroom items on a regular basis.

## 5 TAKE IT HOME

Every week you will receive a parent card letting you know what your child learned in class. This card is a great way to connect what they are learning in church to their everyday world. These cards typically contain conversation starters and activities that your child can do at home to help make what they learned a little more sticky!
